## **Summary/Description**

SLOW POKE is a 1987 Grand Banks 46 Classic Trawler with twin Cat 3208TA diesels, making her faster than the "slow poke" Ford Lehman's.

She cruises easily at 11-12 knots at 2300 RPM. She is equipped with generator, 3 zone air conditioning, clothes dryer, older electronics and a semi-customized aft cabin which was designed to be more spacious than the standard layout. One of the most impressive features is her fiberglass decks, and S/S railings eliminating the maintenance of exterior teak trim. She has only had two owners since she was built, both being knowledgeable and caring owners. **SLOW POKE** will be stored inside in a heated shed for the winter. Please come and inspect her. #### **Overview**

**VESSEL DETAILS** 

**HULL & DECK:** 

White gelcoat topsides, blue boottop, blue bottom.

Fiberglass laminate hull topsides.

Fiberglass with cored decks, Awlgripped cream color (never had teak decks).

Superstructure - fiberglass with cored laminate.

Dual helm - Capilano hydraulic steering.

Nu-Teak composite wide swim platform with swim/boarding ladder.

Transom door.

Three new deck hatches, one with solar ventilator.

Fiberglass rudders - 15" wide x 23" high.

Aluminum mast and boom with S/S standing rigging.

Two Capstan style 12V anchor windlasses, one at bow/anchor pulpit, and one aft at transom rail.

Fiberglass anchor bow platform with two rollers.

Hot and cold shower and washdown at transom.

Almost no exterior teak - S/S railings and handrails.

Bruce 30kg, 100' 5/16" chain and 250' rode.

Danforth 44 S/S anchor and Danforth 22 HT anchor.

Spare anchor chain and rode for aft anchor at transom.

Aft companionway hatch blue Dodger.

#### **ELECTRICAL**:

12V DC & 110V AC systems with AC-DC circuit breaker panels.

2022 six AGM batteries; 2-8D Lifelines for house, 2-8D AGM for each engine start, 1-4D AGM battery, 1 Group 27 AGM generator battery.

Two Balmar alternators - Balmar 150 and Balmar 120 amp, on port engine to charge starting and house batteries.

One alternator on starboard engine to charge the starboard engine starting bank.

Seven Guest battery switches in engine room.

Westerbeke 8kw generator, approximately 1200 hours.

Trace 3000w inverter - battery charger (charges inverter bank of batteries).

Dayton Fleet battery charger; True Charge 40 battery charger (charges starter and house batteries).

#### ACCOMMODATIONS:

Several custom interior changes done by her original owners includes a wider aft cabin layout.

Aft cabin includes walkaround queen berth, and wide desk and stool to port of the full sized access door and stairs to aft deck.

To starboard are numerous drawers and lockers; to port are more generous-sized lockers.

To port forward is an ensuite Vacuflush head, sink and lockers.

There is a large hanging lockers on centerline and to starboard is the separate shower room.

One steps up to the main salon with 360 degree visibility and two side doors to access the side decks. The salon is spacious and bright with the lower helm to starboard, and dry bar or storage aft.

An L-shaped settee is also to starboard with a varnished teak drop leaf dining table and two swivel stools, accommodating six for dinner.

To port are two swivel blue upholstered chairs.

Next forward and down is the spacious galley. The galley includes a new LPG Force 10 three burner stove and oven, 110V refrigerator-freezer runs off inverter or generator, double S/S sinks, many lockers and drawers and a microwave.

Further forward is a spacious vee berth cabin with drawers under, large hanging lockers and bookshelves.

An ensuite head with Vacuflush fresh water W.C., and sink and shower. There is also a locker which houses the clothes dryer.

The interior joinerwork in all Grand Banks is varnished teak with varnished teak parquet soles. It is of the highest quality construction.
